Mayo PPN Community Wellbeing Vision Statement for County Mayo

The first step in developing the plan was to identify what the collective Vision and priorities are for the county. Mayo PPN Suite of Training Courses for Community Groups

Mayo PPN Suite of training courses are currently underway. This is free training for Community Groups registered with Mayo PPN. Courses are online and in big demand with large numbers in attendance with over 300 participants availing of the training so far. Further training courses and workshops are continually rolled out.

Co. Mayo Wind Farm plans submitted SSE Renewables has partnered with FuturEnergy Ireland, which is backed by Coillte and the ESB, to develop plans for a 21-turbine wind farm in the townland of Sheskin, Co. Mayo. Permission for the €100m project has been sought from An Bord Plean ala. Once operational, the wind farm is expected to generate enough electricity to supply around 83,000 homes, and a community benefit fund will be created to support local activities over the first 15 years of its lifespan.
